This Sunday is more fully titled: Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It concludes the Church Year.

Pastor Comments: Thanksgiving is uniquely an American holiday. It should almost be qualified as a Holy Day from which holiday gets its name in the first place. On this Thanksgiving week-end I reprint the following from A BLESSED NATION (guess who wrote it?): "We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of heaven. We have been preserved, these many years, in peace and prosperity. We have grown in numbers, wealth and power, as no other nation has ever grown. But we have forgotten God. We have forgotten the gracious hand which preserved us in peace, and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us; and we have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too proud to pray to the God that made us! It behooves us, then, to humble ourselves before the offended power, to confess our national sins, and to pray for clemency and forgiveness." (Answer: Abraham Lincoln during the Civil War 1863)

How about another 'who said it'? "Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, or baptism without church discipline, Communion without confession. Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without a cross, grace without Jesus Christ living and incarnate." (Answer...not a crusty Vatican cardinal but Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a German Lutheran Pastor who resisted the Nazis and was hanged in a concentration camp in 1945.) On today's feast we recall that we will answer to the King of the Universe, Jesus.
